Conjunctions Pack

Use the sets of pictures with the child to encourage them to use the appropriate conjunction.

Start with the pictures from one conjunction and then work through all the conjunctions in the pack.

Explain which conjunction you are working on. Introduce the first picture and talk about what is happening. Give the child the start of the sentence and then encourage the child to use the given conjunction to complete the sentence when they are shown the second picture.

As the child gains in confidence, you can mix up the conjunction pictures to work on more than one conjunction during a session.
